OBJECTIVES OF THE SEMINAR

With this seminar, EPF will provide patients' organisations with tools to advocate effectively and to become more empowered stakeholders at European and national level.

More specifically, this seminar aims at:

- Raising knowledge and awareness among national patient organisations on how to get involved in the development, transposition and implementation of key EU health and research policies;
- Increasing the cooperation between stakeholders, such as umbrella patient movements, national and regional decision-makers, health professionals' associations and regulatory bodies.
- **Meet with peers:** this seminar is a chance to network and increase cooperation between patient organisations within and across the Nordic countries.
