INTRODUCTION

- Slovenian national contact point on crossborder healthcare – NCP
- established on the basis of Directive 2011/24/EU of the European Parliament and of the Council of 9 March 2011 on the application of patients' rights in cross-border healthcare and on the basis of the Act Amending the Health Care and Health Insurance Act (HCHA);
- operational from 6th November 2013;
- the responsibilities of the NCP are implemented by the Health Insurance Institute of the Republic of Slovenia.

NCP responsibilities

Article 77b. HCHA

- Informing patients':
- healthcare providers,
- patients' rights and obligations,
- reimbursement of costs,
- other NCP
- rights and procedures.
- Other responsibilities:
- Consultation with patient organisations, healthcare providers and providers and health insurance holders,
- Cooperation with the NCP and the European commission,
- exchange od the information between NCP.



 treatment according to Regulation (EC) no. 883/2004 (Art 44.b. HCHA);

 the right to cross-border health care as laid down by the Directive (Art. 44.c. HCHA);

The right to emergency treatment in EU and EEA.
