

## WHO IS EPF?

The European Patients' Forum, more widely known as EPF, is a non-profit and independent non-governmental organisation based in Brussels, Belgium. It was set up in 2003 to become the strong and united collective patients' voice to put patients at the centre of EU healthcare policy and programmes.

EPF is the **umbrella organisation** of pan-European and national patient

organisations active in the field of European public health and health advocacy. Through our strong advocacy activities, we strive for patient-centred and equitable access to high-quality healthcare for all citizens throughout the EU. EPF facilitates exchange of good practices on patients' rights, equitable access to treatment and care, and health-related quality of life between patient organisations at the European level and at Member State level.

### **EPF MEMBERSHIP**

EPF currently has **55 members** that are **pan-European patients' organisations** and **national platforms of patient organisations**. To become an EPF full member, organisations have to fulfil criteria relating to **legitimacy**, **representation**, **democracy**, **accountability** and **transparency**.

Organisations that do not meet the five Full Membership criteria but intend to do so in the foreseeable future will become **Provisional Members**. If they do not meet the criteria within two years, then they will be considered as **Associate Members**.
