GAMIAN-Europe has been involved since the beginning – is a co-founder of EPF

Prevalence of mental illness

1 out of 4 people is confronted with a mental health problem (life time prevalence);

Burden of mental illness

is higher than the burden of cancer + cardio vascular diseases;

IMPORTANCE OF GAMIAN INVOLVEMENT ON EPF



Comorbidity

- Majority (85%) of people with mental illness have physical problems;
- Majority of people with physical illness have mental problems (neglected situation).

→ All patients associations are confronted with mental health problems

Patients involvement at Policy level



- ❖ GE is involved in strategic projects aimed at influencing policies at the national/European level:
 - WHO,
 - WFMH,
 - EMA,
 - European Parliament (Interest group),
 - EC,...
- ❖ GE is represented, or is collaborating with most NGO's (EPF, EBC, EPPOSI, EUCOMED, EPFIA...)

- ✓ initiate "working relations" with the European Commission and European Parliament;
- ✓ enable to support interactive dialogues on key policy issues with other European stakeholders in healthcare;
- ✓ ensures that policies are communicated effectively for the benefit of patients;
- ✓ it became imperative to work at this level in developing healthcare delivery systems that benefit patients.

- representativity
- ♠ transparency
- following and responding to EU developments

Some difficult points to overcome:

- high cost of the consultancy fees
- incertitude of the outcome
- potential effects on the finances

Listening to the voice of patients



- Strategic projects to listen to the patients voice:
 - Annual convention (information, education and exchange);
 - Annual regional Seminar (education and discussion);
 - Social Media (exchange and getting closer);
 - Surveys (listen to the expert by experience).

GAMIAN-Europe Surveys




Some difficult points to overcome:
