


National contact point for EU/EES-citizens seeking medical care in Sweden.





Implementation of the Cross-border health care directive in Sweden

The Cross-border Healthcare directive 2011/24/EU was implemented as a national law in Sweden October 1_{st} 2013



Implementation of the Cross-border health care directive in Sweden

- Swedish patients are reimbursed for planned medical care in the EU/EES if:
- the care has been provided by medical staff
- the costs should have been covered by public funds if the medical care had been given in Sweden
- It is optional to apply for prior authorization



Implementation of the Cross-border health care directive in Sweden

- Patients should not be denied the right to compensation solely on the basis that the treatment is not used in Sweden, as long as the treatment is based on *"international medical science and generally recognised good medical practice".*
- The maximum amount of reimbursement is limited to the equivalent care costs in Sweden.




Administrative procedures

- Swedish Social Insurance Agency makes the decision
- County councils provide documentation and information about the treatments
- The patient's home county council is responsible for covering the costs
- Swedish Social Insurance Agency is required to make a decision within 90 days




Main types of medical care (2013)



The most typical patient in 2013 lived in the south of Sweden and went to neighbouring Denmark for cataract surgery due to long waiting lists in the county council. It was also quite common for patients with psoriasis or other dermatological diseases to go abroad for climate treatment in Spain and other countries in southern Europe.
