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HEALTHCARE MODELS NEED TO INCORPORATE PATIENTS



The current global financial, economic and social crises have resulted in substantial cuts in healthcare budgets. EPF reiterated at the <u>15th edition of</u> <u>the European Health Policy Forum</u> <u>Gastein</u> that we believe that the slashing of health budgets should halt as a knee jerk response to the crisis. The crucial element to be incorporated in future health care models is: the patient.

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On 24 September 2012 EPF attended a <u>lunch debate organised by European</u> Voice on the European Commission's <u>legislative proposal for a Regulation on</u> <u>clinical trials</u>. At this event, EPF highlighted three issues of concern to our members that were not explicitly addressed by the other discussants: information to patients and informed consent; patients' access to results of clinical trials; and patient involvement in clinical trials.

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THREE REPORTS TO SHAPE PATIENT INVOLVEMENT IN HTA

THE MEDICAL DEVICES PROPOSAL



Susanna Palkonen, EPF vice president, gave a foretaste of our position on the Commission's proposal on Medical Devices at the MedTech Forum, on 11 October in Brussels. She highlighted that, in EPF's perspective, the future regulation should aim at achieving a high level of patient safety and quality of care together with improved transparency and information for patients.

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"EPF TAKES A STAND ON THE EU TRANSPARENCY DIRECTIVE"



National measures on pricing and

reimbursement of medicines have a direct impact on patients' access to therapies. This is why on 1 October we released our position statement on the so-called Transparency Directive (Council Directive 89/105/EEC). Overall, EPF welcomes the Commission's proposal as it marks a step forward for more transparent and effective processes. However further steps are needed to strengthen good governance and improve patients' access to therapies.

EPF has just released three consecutive reports to help patients gaining a foothold in the HTA process.

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REPORT "REDESIGNING HEALTH IN EUROPE FOR 2020"



As member of the EU Task Force of high level advisors on e-Health, our President Anders Olauson has presented the <u>Task Force's report</u> <u>"Redesigning health in Europe for</u> <u>2020"</u> at the Danish eHealth Observatory's Annual Meeting on 9 September. In this report the group has identified five levers for change and formulated five recommendations for action.

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The European Patients' Academy for Therapeutic Innovation (EUPATI) has released a <u>report</u> about its first steps towards the development of pan-European and national infrastructures after its inaugural regional workshop, held in Frankfurt, Germany, on 5 September 2012. On the agenda: National Liaison Teams and National Platforms, network and communication opportunities, the collection of educational material and the delivery of trainings.

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PATIENTS' VOICE HEARD AT THE HORATIO FESTIVAL ON PSYCHIATRIC NURSING



Anders Olauson addressed a keynote speech at the 2nd Horatio Festival 2012, the festival of the European Psychiatric Nurses, on 23 September in Stockholm, Sweden. The event was entitled "Vision, Knowledge and Practice" and our President has decided to change the order of these words to illustrate the patients' voice in mental health issues.

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BIOLOGICS AND BIOSIMILARS EXPLORATORY MEETING IN BRUSSELS



On 27 September, EPF attended a meeting bringing together health professionals and patient groups to discuss the challenges and potential of biologics and biosimilars, particular in the current economic climate and-some of the pharmacovigilance and safety issues linked to biosimilars.
