A WORD FROM OUR PRESIDENT AND OUR SECRETARY GENERAL

A warm welcome to the February issue of the EPF Newsletter.

Patient safety and quality of care have been one of our core priority areas for EPF since our establishment and form a key component of our policy work in all areas. We start from the principle that patients have a fundamental right to expect safe care, and also have a legitimate role, both individually and collectively, in developing and implementing policies for patient safety and quality, and evaluating them from the end-user's perspective.

Throughout 2015 we will focus on raising awareness and disseminating information and advocacy tools on patient safety. This will include patients' rights, complaints and redress, and will build on the outcomes of the European Commission's mapping of patients' rights in all member states. We will therefore have four special sections in our newsletter on this topic: hand hygiene in this February issue; healthcareassociated infections (HAI) in the June issue; prevention of medication errors in August; and highlight antimicrobial resistance (AMR) in November at the occasion of the European Antibiotic Awareness Day.



This month we have our first dossier about hand hygiene. If not properly implemented, it can affect the lives of millions of people. Patients as individuals or in organisations have a great role to play there to prevent the harm arising from insufficient healthcare. Jolanta Bilinska is a Patient Safety Champion and she explains her work to encourage people to clean hands properly to prevent diseases. In this issue you will also read about our first mini-workshop organised this year in Croatia and our Capacity Building Programme's installation in Cyprus. We also put the spotlight on two of our members: the European Cleft Organisation and the European Multiple Sclerosis Platform.

It is finally our pleasure to welcome Valentina Stylianou from Cyprus who will be supporting our communication and campaign work until the end of the summer.

A 2009 survey for UNICEF showed that nearly 40% of parents of children born with clefts in Bulgaria were advised to leave their baby in an institution.
